

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Introduction to Admissions

Rydal Penrhos is a distinctive school with a unique standing in the North Wales region and widely respected well beyond the north west of Great Britain. We are small enough to care for each pupil as an individual and large enough to offer real choice and breadth in our academic programme, both in our Prep School and Senior School. Our community, both pupils and staff, are guided by these principles:

- Living joyfully

We are delighted that you are considering Rydal Penrhos School for your son or daughter and we appreciate that choosing a school is one of the most important decisions a parent makes. Our admissions team aims to answer your questions and make the entrance process as smooth and simple as possible.

We recommend that you first visit the school by making an individual appointment with our admissions team. We will arrange for you to meet the Head and take a personal tour of the school, usually during a normal school working day in term time. You are welcome to come either with or without your children. You will also meet one of our admissions team who will explain the entrance process to you.

We also hold various open mornings throughout the academic year where you will see a variety of school activities and be offered a tour by our pupils.

Admissions Process

NURSERY, PRE-PREP AND PREP (YEAR GROUPS RECEPTION – YEAR 6)

The main points of entry are for Nursery and Reception but we will consider entry to all Year groups, subject to availability of places. Following a tour of the Prep School, parents will be invited to arrange for their child to spend a morning in our Nursery or a whole day in the Prep School. Informal assessment will take place during this day. As part of the admissions process we will request a copy of the child's full birth certificate, most recent school report from any previously attended school and will also contact the school for a reference. Applications are processed throughout the year. Children entering our Nursery must be 2½ years old.

NURSERY, PRE-PREP PREP SCHOOL REGISTRATION

The registration form should be completed and returned with the registration fee. Following a satisfactory taster session and receipt of any reports and references, parents will receive an offer letter from the Head which should be signed and returned. Upon receipt, the admissions team will contact you to arrange a start date and provide you with our new pupil handbook.

MOVING ON

There is no expectation that children enrolled in our Nursery must continue into the Prep School but a place is guaranteed if they wish to do so. We generally expect that most children enrolled into the Prep School will continue to our Senior School and there is no additional registration required for them if they do so. They may also apply for scholarships for entry to Year 7.

Admissions Process

SENIOR SCHOOL YEARS 7-10

Pupils seeking admission in Years 7-10 are expected to sit the Entrance Examination. These consist of examinations in Literacy, Numeracy and Non-verbal reasons for Years 7-9 and English and Mathematics for Year 10. In addition, they will meet with a senior member of staff for a short interview. The current school will also be asked to provide a satisfactory reference. We will also require a copy of the child's full birth certificate and most recent school report.

Assessments take place in mid-January and dates are published on our school website or can be obtained from the admissions team. We are able to accept late applications during the year subject to availability and the entrance examinations will still be taken as above. We can arrange for these to be taken at Rydal Penrhos or at the current school depending on individual circumstances.

Offers of places in Year 11 are not normally made. However, any pupils seeking a place in Year 11 should contact the school directly to discuss individual circumstances and GCSE options. Any offer of a place will be at the Head's discretion. It is generally expected that most pupils enrolled in the Senior School will remain for our Sixth Form.

SIXTH FORM

Our Sixth Form welcomes pupils from a wide range of schools and backgrounds. We are delighted to be able to offer both A levels and BTEC courses. We accept applications for entry throughout the academic year subject to availability.

An offer of a place is conditional on the pupil gaining at least five GCSE passes in grade 4 (C) or above and with a recommendation that they achieve grade 6 in the subjects they wish to study at A level or BTEC. A minimum grade 4 (C) in GCSE Maths and English Language is required. Pupils will be expected to meet the Head or another senior member of staff for an informal interview before an offer is made. The current school will be asked to provide a satisfactory reference. Grades at GCSE should be confirmed as soon as they are known and the offer will be confirmed. If your child has not been studying the UK curriculum and will not be sitting GCSE or IGCSE please contact the admissions team to discuss his or her individual circumstances.

Applications from Overseas Applicants

We welcome pupils from all countries at Rydal Penrhos School and have a varied international community with over 20 nationalities.

Where pupils are unable to attend Rydal Penrhos School to take entrance examinations or interview in person, we are able to put alternative arrangements in place. There are two examinations in English and Mathematics for all year groups. Testing can be arranged with an applicant's current school or at the offices of one of our approved overseas agents.

Interviews will be arranged via Skype. Representatives from our school travel extensively and we can also arrange examinations and interviews in your home country subject to their availability. In all cases we will require a copy of the child's full birth certificate, recent school report and we also reserve the right to contact the current school for additional information on the pupil. For pupils requiring a visa we will also need a copy of the child's current passport.

For entry into Sixth Form for pupils who have not studied GCSE, we will require evidence that the current school curriculum has given pupils the potential to achieve well at A level or BTEC.

Applications from Overseas Applicants

SENIOR SCHOOL AND SIXTH FORM REGISTRATION

The registration form should be completed and returned with the registration fee. Upon receipt, a place is reserved for him or her at the appropriate entry level, subject to the child satisfying the School's entrance requirements. The admissions team will make the arrangements for the entrance examinations and will request a reference from the existing school. Parents should also provide a copy of the child's full birth certificate and most recent school report with the registration form or as soon as possible. You will be advised of the entrance examinations arrangements by our admissions team.

Following satisfactory testing and references, parents will receive an offer letter from the Head with an acceptance form which should be signed and returned by the deadline stated. Offers for those sitting entrance examinations in January are usually received by the end of February.

New Pupil Handbooks will be issued in advance of the pupils starting the school.

Fees

Fees are charged as annual payment for an academic year. Fees are payable in accordance with the School's Terms and Conditions. Fees are billed three times a year in three equal instalments. Monthly payments may be made through School Fee Plan credit scheme. Details are available from the Bursar's Office. Parents must give one term's notice in writing to withdraw a child from the school.

OPTIONAL EXPENSES

It is the aim of Rydal Penrhos to make our fees as fully inclusive as possible. Additional personal expenses (e.g. music lessons, school trips etc.) will be billed in arrears with the fee bill for the forthcoming term.

Scholarships

SENIOR SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS – GENERAL INFORMATION

Rydal Penrhos School offers scholarships to reward excellence and recognise exceptional talent in academic abilities, music, sport, drama and art.

Scholarships are available to new pupils starting at Rydal Penrhos in Years 7 and 9 and the Sixth Form. They are also available to pupils transferring from the Prep School at Year 7.

Scholars are a core part of school life at Rydal Penrhos. Scholars take the lead in the academic and co-curricular life of the School with active involvement in societies, committees and teams providing demonstrable leadership, inspiration and excellent role models for other pupils. All scholarships are tenable throughout the holder's time at school subject to the Head's satisfaction with the holder's performance and behaviour.

Scholarship examinations and assessments are normally held at the same time as entrance examinations in January for Years 7 and 9.

Sixth Form scholarships are held in November each year.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

Parents wishing to enter their child for a scholarship should complete the scholarship application form which can be obtained from the admissions team and return it by the published deadline with the scholarship examination entry fee. All applicants are expected to attend the examinations or practical assessments on the scholarship day(s). Ad-hoc arrangements for scholarships at other times of the year cannot be made. All candidates will need to supply their most recent school report and Rydal Penrhos will also request a reference from the candidate's current school. In assessing candidates, we are not simply recognising existing talent but will also take into consideration pupils' future potential, motivation and aspiration.

In recognition of outstanding ability, achievement and potential scholars are offered a reduction in fees to the value of 10 percent per scholarship awarded. Candidates are only permitted to enter for a maximum of two scholarships.

We encourage parents of potential scholars who anticipate difficulty in meeting the full school fees to apply at the same time for one of the school's means-tested bursaries. Please see information below in the section on financial assistance.

Information outlining application deadlines and examination dates for each scholarship is available annually from our admissions team.

ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Academic scholars benefit from a bespoke Scholarship programme of enrichment and opportunities to ensure our most gifted and talented pupils are challenged and stimulated to reach their potential. Scholars are expected to attend the Scholarship Day and awards are given based on the results of scholarship examinations, interviews and potential.

YEAR 7 AND 9

Candidates will sit the Entrance Examinations plus two additional scholarship papers. All candidates will be interviewed. It is expected that an Academic Scholar will be working at a level which will lead them to achieve Levels 7, 8 and 9 in their GCSEs.

YEAR 12

Candidates will sit the examinations in two subjects of their choice. At least one should be in a subject the candidate intends to study in the Sixth Form. All candidates will be interviewed. An offer of a scholarship for Sixth Form is conditional on the pupil achieving their required GCSE grades.

YEAR 12 GILLIAN CAMPBELL AND DONALD HUGHES SCHOLARSHIPS

The School offers 100% academic awards which provide free day places for day pupils of high ability starting at Rydal Penrhos in Year 12 (Sixth Form) only. The awards are highly competitive and candidates are expected to achieve a minimum of six level, 7,8 and 9 grades at GCSE.

The awards are means tested and are available to applicants whose families have a combined gross income which does not exceed £40,000 per annum. To be eligible for one of these awards a candidate must currently be studying for GCSEs at a state school in North Wales and must provide evidence to support this. The criteria for both scholarships are identical and an equal number of places is available for both girls and boys. Any candidate entering for one of these awards will automatically be considered for an Academic Scholarship if they are not successful.

The award includes the payment of the day school fees, any general charges and exam fees. It excludes the cost of the Sixth Form uniform and extras such as stationery, insurance, school trips etc.

In applying for this award, parents must complete a declaration of income. A form is available on request from the admissions team.

ART SCHOLARSHIPS

Art scholarships are awarded to talented artists who have a passion and love of the subject and are able to talk thoughtfully about their work and the work of other artists. Scholars are required to take Art at GCSE and would be expected to continue to A level.

Art scholars have the opportunity to enter prestigious national competitions and attend workshops given by visiting artists and designers. They also have the use of the Art Department after school, in the evenings and some weekends as well as exhibiting inside and outside of school.

All candidates for an Art Scholarship will be expected to have a satisfactory level of academic ability assessed through the Entrance Examination process for Year 7 and 9 or GCSE results at Year 12. They should display a strong performance across the range of practical assessments. The assessment will require each candidate to attend an informal interview and produce the following:

- A portfolio of a minimum of five items of work (plus a completed sketchbook if available). Quality is more important than quantity and the aim is to show a variety of work which best demonstrates the candidate's skills and ability. Candidates may include three-dimensional work or photographs of the work if pieces are fragile. Candidates will discuss their work and interest in art with the Head of Art. At least one piece of work should have been undertaken independently outside the classroom or school.
- Drawing from observation. Candidates will be asked to produce an observational drawing on the day of the examination. If they have their own preferred drawing materials, they are welcome to bring them.

All work will be assessed by the Head of Art.
The art scholarship assessment lasts approximately one hour 15 minutes.

DRAMA SCHOLARSHIPS

The Drama Department boasts an excellent reputation and has a longstanding history of outstanding performances. There are regular school performances throughout the year offering all pupils the opportunity to become involved. Drama is popular throughout the school with many pupils taking it at GCSE and A level and the School is proud of its former pupils who have gone on to enjoy successful professional careers on the stage or in film. Drama scholars benefit from additional support to nurture their talents and interests as well as trips to see a variety of professional productions.

Drama scholarships are awarded to candidates for entry to Year 7, 9 and 12 who show not only an outstanding practical ability but also display a passion and love of drama and a willingness to share this passion with others.

Year 7 and 9 scholars are expected to take GCSE drama and continue to A Level while Year 12 candidates are expected to study A Level Drama.

All candidates will be expected to have a satisfactory level of academic ability assessed through the Entrance Examination at Years 7 and 9 and GCSE results at Year 12. They should display a strong performance in the following practical assessments:

- Perform a poem
 - Act out a speech from a published play
- Both Items 1 and 2 should be learnt by heart and candidates must bring a copy of the pieces to the interview. These individual presentations should last no longer than four minutes in total.
- The candidate will be given an idea for an improvisation and/or a mime for which preparation time of a few minutes will be given
 - The candidate will be given an opportunity to discuss what they have achieved in drama so far e.g. theatre and/or workshop groups out of school, Grade Examinations (LAMDA, Guildhall), participation in school productions and theatre visits

The assessment will take approximately two hours.

MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Music is integral to school life at Rydal Penrhos with more than half of all pupils learning at least one instrument. While scholarship candidates should demonstrate achievements in Associated Board or similar examinations, the potential and innate musicality of each candidate is equally important. It is expected that Year 7 and Year 9 music scholars would take music at GCSE and continue to A level while Year 12 scholars should be taking A Level Music. Full participation in the musical life of school will also be expected. Scholars will benefit from additional sessions and bespoke support according to each pupil's requirements. Scholars are also entered for prestigious competitions such as the Chester Festival and will feature in performances throughout the school year.

All candidates will be expected to have a satisfactory level of academic ability assessed through the Entrance Examination at Years 7 and 9 and GCSE results at Year 12.

They should display a strong performance across the following practical assessments:

- Candidates should prepare two contrasting pieces on their main instruments. Accompaniments should be provided a week before the assessment date.
- If the candidate has composed a piece, he or she should bring a recording of it, or better still perform it
- Voice can be offered as the main instrument or second study. If voice is offered as a main instrument, a short hymn or song should be sung from memory. The candidate should provide the accompaniment a week before the assessment
- Candidates will be asked to perform aural tests including clapping and singing back short melodies
- Candidates will have an interview with the Director of Music to discuss their musical experiences to date and their musical ambition and interests.

The assessment will take approximately 30 minutes.

SPORT SCHOLARSHIPS

The Rydal Penrhos Sports Scholarship Programme aims to provide successful candidates with the support they require to develop as athletes while studying in a high-achieving, academic school. As pupils progress to the Sixth Form, this may be in pursuit of a full-time sports career.

The School's sports staff are ably equipped to support pupils in their athletic development, many with playing and coaching experience to regional, national and international level. The School's full-time Strength and Conditioning staff are also on hand to support the development of each individual on the scholarship programme. Rydal Penrhos has an enviable reputation in the sporting arena. The School plays against other independent schools and high-performing state schools in Wales, across the North-West of England and further afield. Many of our sports teams have athletes who compete to regional and national level notably in rugby, cricket and girls' and boys' hockey.

The School boasts outstanding sports facilities: multiple sports pitches, including a first-class cricket square, Astro-turf, Fives courts, boat park with private slipway, golf practice and coaching area, swimming pool and a Performance Centre and Cardiovascular Studio.

Successful candidates must demonstrate exceptional sporting potential and will currently play at, or show the potential to play at, regional level or above in one or more of these sports:

Rugby, Cricket, Hockey, Golf, Tennis, Hockey, Netball

Priority may be given to an individual sport or a specific playing position within a sport at any given time.

Candidates who excel in other sports, including sailing, cross country, Fives, triathlon and athletics are also required to demonstrate exceptional sporting ability or potential in the sports listed above.

All candidates will be expected to have a satisfactory level of academic ability assessed through the Entrance Examination at Years 7 and 9 and GCSE results at Year 12.

Potential sports scholars will be invited to undergo a practical assessment day. This will involve skills and technical playing ability as well as fitness testing. All candidates will be interviewed by the Director of Sport and should also prior to the assessment complete a Sports Scholarship Additional Information Form. The form can be obtained from the admissions office.

The assessment will take approximately five hours.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Scholarships may be supplemented by financial assistance in the form of means-tested bursaries. Bursaries are normally only available to successful scholarship candidates and the level of support varies according to parental need.

At the time of application for scholarship, both parents are required to complete an in-depth financial circumstances form and the assessment is conducted in accordance with the Charities Commission guidelines.

We also reserve the right to request additional financial evidence to support the application or on occasion to request a home visit to make a further evaluation of circumstances. Bursaries will be assessed where candidates can demonstrate a family gross annual income of £80,000 or less. It is expected that both parents should be contributing to the income of the family unless there are mitigating circumstances.

The maximum award when combined with a scholarship will be no more than 70% of the day fee. If parents wish their child to board then the full or weekly boarding element of the fee is payable in full.

There is a total limit to the amount of assistance that can be offered to pupils in any one year due to the availability of School funds and all bursary holders will be asked to complete an annual declaration of income with bursaries reassessed on an annual basis. As a bursary is awarded to support a pupil whose parents would not otherwise be able afford to pay full fees, it follows that an improvement in parental financial circumstances would normally lead to a reduction in the level of bursary awarded. The school is grateful for the support of the Rydal Penrhos Charity which allows us to give support to those who would benefit from a Rydal Penrhos education but do not have the means to afford it.

University Destinations

Rydal Penrhos pupils take up places at first class universities across the UK and beyond, to study a diverse range of subjects, from Medicine to Modern History, Politics and Economics to Engineering or Law. On average around 50% of our pupils each year move on to Russell Group universities.

Careers guidance is offered throughout the Senior school through the PHSE programme. The Heads of Sixth Form and Careers support pupils throughout the UCAS application process and run a lecture series of guest speakers – often former pupils – who talk to current pupils about their professions and careers. Additional guidance is available for pupils wishing to apply to Oxbridge as part of our Gifted and Talented Seminar Programme.


